

TALK #1 "THE FAMILY OF GOD"

What is "the church"?

What does it mean for you to be a part of "your" church?

The Household of God

1 Timothy 3:5 – If anyone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of God's church?

1 Timothy 3:15 – I have written so that you will know how people ought to act in God's household, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the truth.

Romans 8:14-17 – All those led by God's Spirit are God's sons. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption, by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father! The Spirit Himself testifies together with our spirit that we are God's children, and if children, also heirs —heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ—seeing that we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him. Mark 3:33-35 – He replied to them, "Who are My mother and My brothers?" And looking about at those who were sitting in a circle around Him, He said, "Here are My mother and My brothers! Whoever does the will of God is My brother and sister and mother."

Mark 10:29-30 – "I assure you," Jesus said, "there is no one who has left house, brothers or sisters, mother or father, children, or fields because of Me and the gospel, who will not receive 100 times more, now at this time —houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions —and eternal life in the age to come.

The blessings of belonging to the family of God

The Gospels make it clear that the church family has a greater claim on us than our biological families. But our domesticated religion tempers this bold assertion. Discussing Christian service, we say: "Obviously, you need to put your family first". The word "obviously" is revealing. Lacking biblical justification, we turn instead to what is "obvious" according to the standards of our culture. While the church should support the family as a God-ordained institution, we do not give it our ultimate allegiance. Is it too much to suggest that for some Christians their biological family has become an idol? Gospel-centred Church

TALK #3 "SEEING THE CHURCH GOD'S WAY"

Don't give up meeting together!

Hebrews 10:24-25

One of our great allies at present is the Church itself. [...] All your patient sees is the half-finished, sham Gothic erection on the new building estate. When he goes inside, he sees the local grocer with rather an oily expression on his face bustling up to offer him one shiny little book containing a liturgy which neither of them understands, and one shabby little book containing corrupt texts of a number of religious lyrics, mostly bad, and in very small print. When he gets to his pew and looks round him he sees just that selection of his neighbours whom he has hitherto avoided.

Three reasons to not give up meeting

1) For our own spiritual health

Time and again, people's first inclination is to withdraw from church. But it's about the worst thing that you can do. It's not that missing one week of church will harden you into unbelief, nor does it mean that there will never be a reason to stay away. Rather, the danger lies in the pattern of withdrawal and in a low estimation of how God's power is working out through the church, irrespective of how you are feeling about it.

Why is it important to go to church? Shockingly, here's the answer that Hebrews gives: so you don't go to Hell! Not because Church makes us right with God: Jesus' death and resurrection do that.
